PERENNIALS (forbs & grasses): The LARGE selections (24" - 48") for SUN.

Amsonia illustris shining blue star

Aster (Symphyotrichum) oblogifolius aromatic aster quite drought tolerant
Baptisia australis false indigo a very long-lived forb

Baptisia sphaerocarpa yellow indigo Echinacea purpurea coneflower

Iris virginica var. shrevei southern blue flag

GRASS-Schizachyrium scoparium little bluestem blue foliage

some collected seed strains offer size

GRASS-Sporobolus heterolepis prairie dropseed compactness

Monarda bradburiana eastern horsemint quite powdery mildew resistant

Monarda fistulosa wild bergamot

Pycnanthemum tenuifolium slender mountain mint beneficial insect magnet

very resistant to septoria leaf spot fungus

Rudbeckia fulgida var. fulgida black eyed Susan (unlike the cultivar `Goldsturm')
